

ITALIAN WEDDING SOUP

Recipe for May 2024 Thank you, Kathy Stompski for the latest recipe.

3/4 tsp. salt

Meatballs: 1/2 lb ground beef or turkey 1/2 cup Italian breadcrumbs

1 egg, whisked

2 cloves garlic, crushed 1/4 tsp. black pepper

Soup: 1 Tbsp. olive oil

3 carrots. diced

8-10cups regular chicken broth 3 cups baby spinach, roughly chopped

3 stalks celery, diced

1/3 cup parmesan cheese

2 Tbsp. olive oil, divided

1/4 cup parsley, finely chopped

½ small onion, diced 1/8-1/4 red pep. flakes 3 cloves garlic

1 cup orzo or acini de pepe pasta

½ lb. ground sausage or turkey sausage

½ tsp salt, to taste 1/4 tsp. pepper, to taste- optional

Add all of the meatball ingredients, except oil to a lg bowl. Mix well. Scoop 2 tsp. and shape into a meatball. Do all the meat mixture. You should end up with approx. 48 meatballs. Add 1 Tbsp. oo to a Dutch oven. Add ½ meatballs. Sear 4-5 minutes, rotating every 1-2 minutes, or until browned. Drain on paper towels, do remaining meatballs. ADD 1 Tbsp OO to pan along with drippings. Stir in diced onions, carrots & celery. Saute 3-4 minutes, then add garlic. Continue cooking 1 minute. Pour in broth and scrape bottom of pot to ensure no bits or pieces stick. Bring broth to a boil. Once boiling add pasta, S & P, red pepper flakes and meatballs. Give a good stir. Cover, reduce to med. heat and simmer 7-9 minutes until pasta is cooked. Once pasta is done, toss in spinach. Serve immediately.

The Historical Building (the old "Town House") at Montgomery Center will be open to the public on **Saturday**, **June 22 from 9:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m.** (same hours as the Library). This is a great opportunity to share with younger family members "how things were" back in the olden days.

Many articles from the past have been donated by local

residents, including artifacts found in our area, tools both from Montgomery and other locations, period clothing, and lots of photos from Montgomery's past. An additional benefit: if you have local historical documents or photos to share, we can scan them for our archives

during the Open House, and return them to you immediately.

EASTERN COTTONTAIL RABBITS

Eastern cottontail rabbit babies are called

kits. Mothers can have 3-8 kits in a litter and they may be born anytime from March through October. She will make her nest in a depression in the ground. The nest could be anywhere including the middle of the yard, along a building wall, under a bush or anywhere she can dig in the dirt and she will line it with her own fur and dried grasses or other vegetation. If you find one it is important to keep pets and children away.

Though it is advisable not to handle them, it is a myth that she will abandon them if touched. She may know they have been handled, but she still wants them home and will continue to feed them if she is able. To avoid attracting attention to them, Mom is only at the nest long enough for nursing at

dawn and dusk and will leave the kits alone for the remainder of the day and night. If there are people or pets in the area, she will delay feeding until it is quiet.

She will nurse them in the nest for only 3-4 weeks and they will start to venture out on their own to nibble on greens as they grow but return to the nest at night. By about 4-5 weeks, even though they look quite small, they are independent and ready to be on their own.

You can save the lives of rabbit kits by checking for nests before you:

- Mow your grass
- Trim weeds or bushes
- Rototill your garden
- Burn brush piles or use fire pits
- Rake long standing leaf piles or mulch
- Keeping cats inside

- HCAA is independently audited by the State for safety and financial compliance annually, all of which conforms and is available for full transparency. The HCAA operation is constantly audited and reviewed independently.
- In my opinion, HCAA provides a great value to our member communities and supporting them and their employees is critical to providing our Hilltown residents pre-hospital care.
